Maths

Number: Place value:

Yr 1 (within 10) —soring objects, counting objects, recognising numbers as words, counting on and back, ordering objects and numbers and comparing numbers.

Yr 2— Recognising tens and ones, partitioning numbers into tens and ones, writing numbers to 100 in words, estimating, comparing and ordering numbers to 100 on a number line, counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.

Number: Addition and Subtraction

Yr 1—number bonds to 10, part—whole models, add or subtract 1 or 2.

Yr 2— number bonds to 10 and 100, addition and subtraction up to 100, 10 more / 10 less , adding three single digit numbers.

Shape

Yr 1—Recognise and sort 2D and 3D shapes, patterns with 2D and 3D shapes..

Yr 2—Recognise 2D and 3D shapes, 2D and 3D shapes , lines of symmetry and patterns with 2D and 3D shapes.

	Word	Meaning
	town	An area with lots of buildings – houses, shops, cinemas etc. It is bigger than a village but smaller than a city.
	village	A group of houses and buildings smaller than a town and in the countryside.
	human feature	A feature that has been built by humans. For example a house or a church.
	physical feature	A natural feature that has not been made by humans. For example, a mountain.
	material	What something is made out of.
	flexible	Something that bends easily without breaking.
