French— A focus on "La chenille qui fait des trous" (The Very Hungry Caterpillar).

Maths—Number: Addition and subtraction

Yr1 - read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving +, - and =. Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20. Add and subtract one—digit and two—digit numbers to 20, including zero.

Yr2—Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently and derive and use related facts up to 100. Add and subtract a two—digit number and ones, Add and subtract a two—digit number and tens, add and subtract two two—digit numbers and add three one—digit numbers.

Number: Multiplication and division

Yr1—solve one -step problems involving multiplication and division by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with teacher support.

Yr2— re-call and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Calculate mathematical statements using the symbols X, ÷ and = .Solve problems involving multiplication and division.

Shape, space and measure 1

Length and height—compare and solve practical problems for length and height. **Yr 2** will use m / cm.

Money—recognise the value of different coins and notes. To recognise the symbols for pounds and pence and make amounts with different coins and notes. They will also think about giving change.

|  | compass | A compass is an instrument that you use for finding directions. |
|  | amphibian | An amphibian lives the first part of their life in the water and the last part of their life on the land. |
|  | reptile | A reptile is a cold - blooded animal that has a backbone and lays eggs. Reptiles live on land and in water. |
|  | mammal | A mammal is a warm - blooded animal with a backbone that has hair or fur and usually gives birth to live babies. There are a few mammals which lay eggs - the duck-billed platypus and the spiny anteater. |
|  | bird | A bird is a creature with feathers, wings and a beak. They lay eggs but not all birds can fly. |
|  | fish | An fish is an animal that lives in water and is covered with scales. A fish has fins to move and gills to breathe under water. A fish lays soft eggs. |
