Parental Conflict

What is Family Transitions Triple P? Family Transitions Triple P is designed for parents who are experiencing personal distress from separation or divorce, which is impacting on or complicating their parenting. The 5 week programme is designed to assist those parents who need extra support to adjust and manage the transition of separation or divorce. It focuses on skills to resolve conflicts with former partners and how to cope positively with stress. In addition to running for 5 weeks, the course can also be delivered over one full day.
