As part of our commitment to keeping all children safe, we would like to raise awareness of allergies and the importance of allergy-safe practices in school. Following the introduction of Benedict's Law schools across England are strengthening their approach to allergy awareness and safety with staff training, emergency response procedures and support for children with allergies.

Whether a school setting has any children, or not, with known severe allergies, we are aware that allergies can develop at any time. We encourage all families to support good habits by reminding children to:

- Never share food or drinks.
- Wash their hands before and after eating.

21st - 27th September 2026

Nepal has announced that its wild tiger population has more than tripled, rising from 121 tigers in 2010, to 429 today. Officials say the turnaround is the result of years of protected wildlife corridors and local communities working hand-in-hand with conservationists to protect the big cats. With tiger numbers now increasing, more encounters between tigers and nearby villages are leaving experts asking how people and wildlife can safely share the same land going forward.

Long ago, the world was not the way God wanted it to be. God asked Noah to build a huge boat, called an ark, and bring his family and two of every kind of animal on board to keep them safe. When the rain came and the waters rose, Noah, his family and the animals stayed safely inside the ark. When the waters went down, they were able to leave and begin again on dry land.

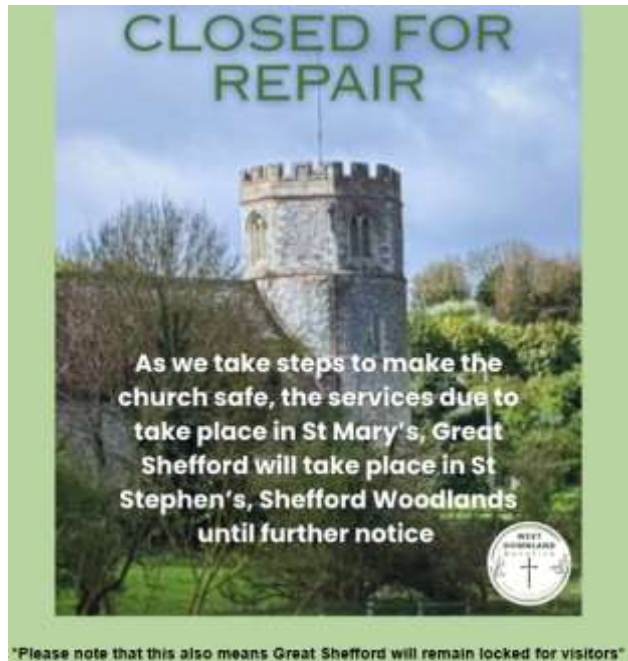

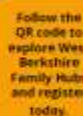

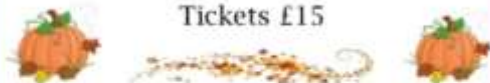
