

Children's Mental Health week...

Our week began with an introduction to the theme of 'Children's Mental Health Week' where we considered firstly what 'mental health' is and how we can keep our minds, as well as our bodies, happy and healthy. We considered our Christian values of Community and Compassion in relation to our own mental health and how we can support others too.



We identified our homes and families, our school and different clubs and communities as places we belong. Then realising that in the places we belong we have positive emotions and responses such as feeling important and valued, feeling safe and supported by others.

We have worked through the week in our classes on ideas and ways we can support our own mental health like making sure we take time to do things we enjoy, spending time outside in the fresh air, sometimes challenging ourselves to try new things, taking time to talk with people we trust and feel safe with and calming breathing techniques.



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
